#### TREATING OURSELVES - PSALM 103

Psalm 103:10 God does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. (NIV)

I've been thinking and reading a lot about forgiveness recently. I think that the writer of Psalm 103 experienced something similar, especially when he wrote these amazing words: "God does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities." Those words give me hope and release me from being vexed about my sins. Through Christ, I am totally forgiven, so there is a lot of room to forgive myself.

Perhaps you're going through something similar and maybe you're feeling the same things. I hope that you will also realize that God's grace is greater than anything you've foolishly done, and that Christ's love is larger than any regret you still hold.
