Pastor's Page

We have been having a lot of storms lately. I'm glad because we've needed the rain. But our dog, Daisy, is terrified by the thunder. When the storms come, she wanders through the house trying to find a place to escape the noise. She hides under the desk. She crawls into tight corners. She begs to go outside hoping the noise is only inside. She can be frantic during the storms. Try though we might, we cannot comfort her when the rolls of thunder start booming. Friends have come up with ideas on comforting her – holding her; giving her treats; distracting her by playing with her; and a few other things. So far the only thing that seems to work is drugging her so she sleeps through the storm. It would be wonderful to be able to explain to her in a way she understands that the storm is just a lot of noise and nothing to fear. That way she could just wait it out.

I wonder if God looks at us like I look at Daisy. We go about our lives and suddenly a storm pops up. Illness booms. Financial difficulties pour down on us. Relationship problems rattle the windows. Difficult people drench us with frustration. Like Daisy, we see the storm and we begin to worry, or fear, or fret. We franticly run around trying to deal with the storm. We try to hide from the problem. We get angry at the problem. We fuss and fume and agitate. The storm has us running around trying to find a safe haven, a place of escape. But there is no way to escape the storm. Sometimes we just need to ride it out. We must dig in and wait until the storm goes away. Sometimes storms come and go quickly leaving us shaken but ready to move on. But sometimes storms stay. They last and last and do their destructive damage. Storms can tear up our lives by the roots; blowing over our

plans, hopes and dreams, and leaving us soaked in doubt and disappointment.

God sees things from a different perspective than we do. He understands our storms far more than we can. He sees what is happening. He knows that "this too shall pass." He wants to tell us to trust, believe, and know that things will change. I'm sure there are times God wants to grab us and hold us and say, "Just wait a little more - this storm will pass soon."

In the Gospel of Mark (4:35-41) is the story of Jesus calming the storm. You'll remember that the disciples were rowing across the lake when a terrible storm blew in. It rocked their boat and threatened to swamp them. Jesus, who understands things from God's perspective, was asleep in the back of the boat. He was at peace even in the midst of a storm. But his disciples were filled with fear. They woke him up and cried out, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?"

Jesus got up and commanded, "Peace! Be still." The wind stopped and it was completely calm.

Are you going through a storm right now? Are you feeling tossed about? About to be swamped? Blown over? Struck by lightning?

God is with us. He knows our need. He knows our hurts. He sees us even in our frantic state. I'm sure He would remind us that He is there, and nothing will separate us from Him and His love. But there is something else He would say to us. Sometimes the greater storm is the one we generate inside us. Sometimes we get so worked up, so fearful, so overwhelmed, so frantic, that we are our own storm. It's times like this that we need Jesus. We need to hear Him say, "Peace! Be still!" We need to remember that He will never leave us nor forsake us and that in His love and grace we can endure whatever storms may come.


Thank you for your support! We will pack the bags with school supplies after the lunch for Rev. Neal on August 21. If you would like to help, just let us know.
