Pastor's page



Police graciously did not release the woman's name.

At least she was partially right - TV, and many other pastimes, do hold us "hostage." So often we can find ourselves involved in things that do nothing but spend time. There is nothing wrong with enjoying our favorite TV shows, doing a hobby, or something else to help pass the time. But there are times when we just disconnect our brains and let time slip away. When we let time go like that, we lose a very precious thing.

If you find you are one who watches time slip by, I'd like to invite you to try an experiment. When you find yourself disconnecting, turn to the Bible. Read through the New Testament first. If keeping a Bible handy doesn't work, add a Bible app to your phone. *You Version* is the app I use. It is free (my favorite price), and it offers verses of the day, devotionals, and study guides. If reading on that tiny screen is hard, it even has an option to have the verses read to you. I'm not trying to sell you an app, but I want to encourage you to get deeper into the scriptures. Try memorizing a verse each week.
