Repetition - Rote or Comfort?

When I began my Supervised Ministry Internship, the liturgy at the church I was at was different than I was used to. I found that I missed, almost viscerally, the Assurance of Pardon that I had become accustomed to. So, on those Sundays when I preached, I was able to draft the liturgy and included the words that my spirit longed to hear each week and which we use here: *Friends, believe the good news! In Jesus*



Christ, we are forgiven! I love this direct, firm statement of forgiveness that we say to one another, as ministers to one another (think "priesthood of all believers" from the Reformation).

These words of the Assurance of Pardon bring me comfort. At a different church, at a different time, the pastor used the same Prayer for Illumination each week. Other pastors use the same Benediction every time. Some pastors vary these elements. But, some elements of worship need to remain the same, such as the Words of Institution for Communion or the Lord's Prayer. Regarding other elements, the pastor can adjust the liturgy to fit the season of the church year, the theme of the sermon, or to give new life to worship. "Liturgy" comes from Greek words for "the work of the people." Thus, "liturgy refers to the words of worship, the prayers, responses, and songs of the people," as well as the visual elements of my stole, paraments on the pulpit and table, banners, etc.

I have chosen to keep the Assurance of Pardon, the Prayer for Illumination, and the Benediction the same each week, as when I was a congregant, these elements brought me comfort. I have also made a commitment to use the Apostles' Creed on the first and third (and usually fifth) Sundays of each month so that our members with vision impairments can participate more easily, but on the second and fourth Sundays, I like to change things up so saying what we believe doesn't become rote and tired.




Communications Committee
