Pastor's page

Has anyone not noticed that it is starting to get hot outside? We've had some toasty days this May. Now that we are headed into June, things are going to get downright uncomfortable. I know I shouldn't complain. I work in an airconditioned office, have an air-conditioned house, and drive an air-conditioned car. I really don't have any right to complain. But I have to leave my air-conditioned house to get to my air-conditioned car. I have to walk all the way across the driveway. And sometimes I walk across a parking lot so I can go into an air-conditioned store. My experience with these brutal temperatures is for very shorts bits of time. So who am I to complain? Well, I actually do get out in the weather a little bit. The dog needs a walk, but even she doesn't like to be out in the weather. Today, she turned back toward home and started pulling me back home, far short of our typical walk. Even the dog knows it's hot outside.

I was grumbling about how hot it was when I drove by a home getting a new roof. I was in my car, while the roofers were working in sun standing on black tar paper. Shortly after that, I saw some people doing landscape work. After that, I saw a delivery truck with the doors open as the worker carried a package up to a home. It's hot outside, but I have no right to grumble. So why do I?

I grumble when I "have" to eat leftovers, when there are people in the world who don't have enough to eat. I grumble when my ice melts in my tea, when there are some who have no clean drinking water. I grumble if traffic is bad, when there are those who must walk everywhere they go. I grumble when I don't find anything interesting on TV, when those who are blind can't watch anything at all. I don't really think of myself as spoiled or selfish. But there are times, I am. What about you? Does thankfulness disappear if the air conditioning isn't set right and leaves you feeling too cold, or too warm? Do you cling to old hurts, and nurture negative feelings? Do you dredge up problems from the past, rather than letting them go? Do you grumble?

Are you like me? Do you need to be reminded just how incredibly blessed you are? We are loved by the Creator of the universe. He has chosen to love us so much He sent his one and only Son to surrender His life for our salvation. Even though we are unappreciative of all He does, He still rejoices over us. He has declared us precious, beloved, and a treasure. He considers our heartfelt prayers to be like perfume. He knows our in-most thoughts, and watches over us no matter where we go. He loves us beyond anything our imagination could conceive. If He had a refrigerator, your picture would be on it.

I'd like for you to pause for a moment, and not worry about how hot it is, or whether the lawn needs watering. Pause and think about the blessings that you have. Take a look around you. Take note of all the wonderful things that are a part of your life. Now, thank God for His wonderful blessings. Thank Him for opening the windows of heaven and allowing His generosity to rain down on you. And for a moment, step outside into the heat, and then come back in. 
Let's pray that our choir can soon be back together!
