

A Church to Call Home

At Vacation Bible School this year, two of the daily themes were "Jesus had a home" and "Jesus went to 'church." In the adult lesson, we read about how Joseph, Mary, and Jesus fled from their home in Bethlehem to Egypt to escape the wrath of King Herod. A story about refugees was used to talk about "home." Matthew 2:13-23 ends with Jesus' family making a new home in Nazareth. We reflected on what makes a place feel like "home" – comfort, care, support, family.

Then we looked at Luke's story of the pre-teen Jesus who remained in the temple in Jerusalem when his parents and extended family traveled back to Nazareth after the Passover observance (Luke 2:41-52). When Mary and Joseph realized

he wasn't with their traveling party, they went back to Jerusalem, eventually finding him in the temple. Reminiscent of my experience with pre-teens, Jesus replied to his parents' anxious questions in a markedly saucy fashion – "did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" We discussed how the temple might have felt like "home" to Jesus and what would make the church feel like home to you, to visitors – comfort, care, support, feeling welcomed as part of the family.

When I've talked to various people about Edgewood and their decision to become a member, invariably they mentioned how it felt like home, that they were welcomed into a family. At the June Session Meeting, we talked about the mission, vision, and values of Edgewood. The same themes arose in our discussion. As we look toward growing and expanding our mission and ministry, this is our strength, what we can and do offer. Being welcoming and hospitable, making visitors (new and returning) feel like part of the family is the work of



the whole



church. And I know that you are up to the task! During the past seven months (wow! Time has flown!), you have made Edgewood feel like home to me; you have welcomed me with open arms into the family!



A new Bible Study on Luke's Gospel is scheduled to begin August 13. Details to come.




Christian Education Committee


Communications Committee



We learned at a Bible Study session that Steve had recently earned a new medical certification, so we asked him to provide details for the newsletter.



I completed a 10-week, 80-hour class which allowed me to sit for the written and practical exams to be a certified First Responder, which is the base level of Emergency



Medical Services. The levels are Emergency Medical Responder, EMT, Advanced EMT, and Paramedic. I felt I needed to further my emergency skills to further protect the athletes at Lee County High School that I serve as a Certified/Licensed Athletic Trainer. I am a believer in life-long learning and anything I can be better prepared for to protect our athletes, I am always looking to improve my skills.

This was one of the most challenging mental and physical endeavors I have ever undertaken. I spent well over 200 hours preparing for the certification practical and written exams.
