# Welcome our new PASTOR!

Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love!

I'd like to begin with a word of gratitude – for you, the members of Edgewood Presbyterian for calling me to serve and for welcoming into your lives; the diligent and faithful work of your Pastor Nominating Committee; the many churches that have supported me and taught me much; for my family and friends for their ongoing love and support; and, above all, for God's love and grace that have called me into ministry and to service at Edgewood. For a quick biography, I grew up in Michigan and was raised in a Presbyterian church. 
#### **Communications Committee**

We printed 250 Thanksgiving cards and 250 Christmas cards for distribution at local long-term care facilities.










